A Word from the Chairman of Deacons, Philip West

Hello church family! I know we are in "uncharted waters" - or at least waters that we have not been swimming in for the past 27 years. While I know there will be challenges for us in the days and weeks ahead, I am also confident that there are blessings ahead for HCBC, and I am excited about seeing what the Lord has in store for us during this period of transition.

In case you were not at the business meeting on August 16 or in worship this past Sunday, August 27, your deacons want to make sure you know where we feel led. We have not made any decisions because they are not our decisions to make. What we do next and the avenue we go is the church's decision.

We spoke with Jeff Crabtree, our KBC Regional Consultant, about what our next step should be. There are a number of options, and certainly some of those options are new ideas that hadn't been thought of the last time our church went through a pastor change. After looking at the options, the deacons feel led that the best option for us is to call a "Transitional Pastor". That is something most of us have not heard of.

Bro. Kevin has been here for 27 years and we are blessed, thankful, and grateful for that and the ministry leadership he provided. As you can imagine, following someone that has been at church for a long time can be really difficult on the next Pastor. They are always being compared to how the precious Pastor did things. In the majority of churches, the Pastor who follows a long time Pastor typically stays at the church for only a year or two. This creates a tough situation that is often difficult on the Pastor and on the church.

What we are going to propose is that we go through an intentional time of transition. During this time, the Transitional Pastor would be here every Sunday bringing the message, but would be doing more than that. He would not be doing things for us, but guiding us in things like: Where are we? What are our strengths? What areas do we need to grow in? He will help form a transition team that will do some important work before we call a new Pastor. He will also help review our church documents and procedures and propose any changes that may be needed. These are things that often times a new pastor would do, but this would get us in better

shape as a church before the Lord sends us our new pastor. Another positive thing is that this process could possibly steer our hearts to the right individual as our next Pastor.

There are people who are called to a Transitional Pastoral Ministry. One of those is a man we have spoken to named Dan Garland. He actually trains men to be Transitional Pastors. He has retired from the full time ministry, and has also served at KBC and Lifeway in a variety of capacities. Some of you may know Pastor Dan. He just went through this same process with Immanuel Baptist Church in Glasgow and finished up with them this past spring.

We as deacons are excited about this process. While we do not know how long it will take, we feel like it will likely be a few months (not weeks, but also not years!).

Pastor Dan Garland will be with us the next couple of Sundays to let us get to know him, and to bring our Sunday morning messages. Sept 3 will be a time for us to get to know him a little and he will probably talk a little bit about the Transitional Pastor process. On Sept 10 he will bring the message, and as a part of that message will layout what this process could look like. There will also be a portion of that service that will be dedicated to trying to answer any questions you may have about the process that is being proposed.

We encourage you to be here both Sundays, but especially September 10. At the end of the service, we will have a special called business meeting to vote on accepting the process of Transitional Pastor and on calling Dan Garland as our Transitional Pastor.

As Bro. Jeff Crabtree has challenged us over the past couple of weeks - please continue to be in prayer for 1)unity in our church, 2)that God will direct our church leadership ,3) for Bro. Kevin & Debbie as they start this new chapter themselves, and 4) for guidance & patience for our church over the next few weeks and months.

While we all likely have some apprehension and uncertainty regarding what lies ahead - I am excited about the possibilities, and I hope you are too. I truly believe the upcoming months can be some of our finest days as a church, and I look forward to being on this journey with each of you! If you have ANY questions about any of this - please do not hesitate to reach out to me, or any of our deacons.






Revelation
